MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

On March 11, 2005, the Satellite Industry Association ("SIA") filed a Petition for Reconsideration ("Petition") of the Second Report and Order and Second Memorandum Opinion and Order ("2nd R&O")¹ in the above-captioned proceeding. On June 30, 2005, Freescale Semiconductor, Inc. ("Freescale") filed an opposition to SIA's Petition ("Opposition").² Replies to this opposition currently are due on July 13, 2005. SIA, pursuant to Section 1.46 of the Commission's rules,³ hereby requests a one-week extension of time, through and including July 20, 2005, to reply to Freescale's Opposition.

SIA's request is supported by good cause. The Opposition raises a number of technical issues, including a four-page technical statement that technical staff must review and analyze. Additionally, some of the relevant individuals involved with SIA's Petition will be out-of-town during portions of the regularly-scheduled reply period, and absent an extension therefore will be unable to participate to the extent



needed in the preparation of a reply. Grant of a one-week extension thus will allow development of a more complete record that will facilitate the Commission's decision in this matter. Pursuant to Section 1.46(c), counsel for SIA has notified counsel for Freescale, as well as the Commission's staff, of this motion.⁴ Counsel for Freescale has authorized the undersigned to state that Freescale will interpose no objection to this extension request.

Accordingly, and for good cause shown, SIA respectfully requests a one-week extension of time to reply to Freescale's Opposition to SIA's Petition for Reconsideration.
